After graduation from Murdoch University she worked as a small animal practitioner in both Gawler and Chandlers Hill in South Australia for 10 years. Following this she was a small animal practitioner and practice owner in Mount Barker South Australia for 17 years.

Throughout 2020 she worked for both AAERC in Adelaide and ARH in Sydney seeing referral dental cases and is now based solely in South Australia. She has a keen passion for teaching and runs personalised laboratory sessions and lectures for veterinary practices on an individual basis as well as lecturing and working in private practice.



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CONTENT

Dental terminology: understanding the language and speaking it as well. This covers AVDC nomenclature and how to use it and recognise it.

How to perform the C.O.H.A.: Comprehensive Oral Health Assessment. Where to start when introducing dental charting. Using on-line and paper based charting and the benefits both immediate and long term.

Tools of the trade: Oral examination tools & how to use them and care for them.

Intra-oral radiology: X-ray technique and safety. How to get the images and what needs to be included. Where anatomical differences need to be considered. Making the most of your time.

Interpreting intra-oral radiographs: Differentiating disease from normal variance. An overview of different disease progressions and patterns displayed radiographically.

How to put it all together: Making sense of what is seen on oral examination in light of the radiographic findings.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

1. Practitioners can expect to leave the laboratory with a clear understanding of how to examine an oral cavity thoroughly and record detailed findings in a timely fashion appropriate for easy integration into patient files.

2. You will be given clear instruction on how to achieve accurate diagnostic radiographs and a starter course in interpretation. Tips and clues on how to improve the image in difficult situations. You can expect to decrease the time taken to achieve diagnostic images, leading to more accurate diagnosis and planning for treatment and maintenance.

3. You will be given information on useful tools and how to use them and can expect to improve your ability to make an oral diagnosis and a plan to keep your patients happy and your clients returning for ongoing care.

4. You can also expect to leave being able to diagnose oral disease with greater accuracy leading to a better understanding of treatment options and plans for oral care for your patients and better satisfying your client needs.
